



Food Security

Every healthy and sustainable community needs to be able to grow its own food to feed the people. Food sovereignty leads to healthy and happy people. This happiness spreads to other facets of community life.

Education



More than 855,000 children out of school, According to UNICEF

Children in Bafut and the Ambazonian community have been out of school for close to 5 years and the world has changed due to Covid-19. If these are tomorrow's leaders they need learning tools and a healthy environment.

Health Systems



Hospitals have been burnt down and the healthcare system is broken. Community health systems too are dysfunctional Victims in the bushes revert to traditional medicine and pregnant women suffer pain and illness. Girls and women have been stripped of their basic human rights.

Our mission here is to reactivate well-being through trauma work and the long term childbirth clinic of the eco-village.

The immediate need is to support the Better World team in Portugal to complete empowerment trainings (TOTs) and have the necessary tools to carry out the reconstruction of Bafut






